





May 26th I love you and miss you so much every day. Love. Mom (Janet Murphy)






My Dear Christina:

I used to be "a go with the flow" person, but since your death, going with the flow no longer works. I need structure/routine to help me get through. So I created a daily schedule. Since I wake up early I go to church daily, then run to the cemetery, and on to stores. Once home I do the daily chores.

Mondays were a little different. I started the day the same, except after Mass I would stay and help out then I would meet with Fr. Richard and talk. He was my rock and my strength. Christina when you died, half of me died too. My heart was shattered into a million pieces and I knew even if I tried to put the pieces together, one would still be missing. I was so lost. Who was I? Who was I to become? Fr. Richard helped me to find myself. He helped me find my faith and the drive to move forward, no matter how hard it will be. Fr. Richard was helping me put my heart back together piece by piece. Then we were hit with the Coro-navirus. Overnight life has once again changed. Church and cemeteries were closed. I couldn't meet with Fr. Richard. My schedule/routine was gone. I happened to see Father in the church parking lot. We briefly spoke. He stood there smiling then told me to take care. He didn't look good. The next day he was rushed to the hospital, put on a vent, and died a week later. Life again has changed. Vincent and his beautiful family keep me going, as well as all the good memories of you! Christina I love you and miss you so much and I know one day we will all be together again.


